Submission details

Authors are required to submit three items:

1. A title (up to 15 words) in the Title Box on the online submission form;
2. An abstract, up to 200 words long, in the Abstract Box on the submission form;
3. A short paper, up to 4 pages long, using the template provided.

Particular attention should be given to the formatting style used in this template. Papers that do not conform to this style will **NOT** be published. To prepare your paper, download the template and start typing your paper in it. Invited Keynote papers may be up to 10 pages long, and use the same template.

Key dates

- Submissions Open –21 December
- Submissions Close – 30 April 2017
- Authors notified of review results – 30 June 2017
- Early bird registration closes on – 31 August 2017
- The presenter of each paper must be registered by 30 September 2017

Oral Presentations

Oral presentations will be 15 – 20 minutes including questions and change-over, depending on the number of submissions. Since there will be multiple sessions, Chairs of sessions will be instructed to keep strictly to the allocated presentation times.

No registrant may present more than 2 papers without paying an additional registration fee.

Conference Proceedings

Only papers that are presented will appear in the official proceedings of the conference. These proceedings will have ISBN and DOI numbers, and be available on library electronic databases.

Journal publication

The conference organisers are discussing a possible special issue of selected papers in one of the Wind Engineering Journals. Further details will be provided when details are confirmed.
